ORLANDO, Fla. (June 23, 2018) – [Habitat for Humanity of Greater Orlando](#) is pleased to announce the expansion of their service area to encompass Osceola County effective immediately. [Habitat for Humanity International](#), the global organization’s headquarters office based in Atlanta, recently awarded Habitat Greater Orlando the additional service area.

“We thank Habitat for Humanity International for entrusting us with this new area and look forward to partnering with residents and leaders in Osceola County to serve families and individuals in need of safe and affordable homes,” said Catherine Steck McManus, President and CEO, Habitat Greater Orlando. “Though Habitat Greater Orlando’s name is changing, our mission remains the same - reaching out with a hand up to our neighbors in need of safe and affordable housing. The great thing is, our hands now reach farther than our city limits to include our neighbors in Osceola County.”
